Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Ten years ago, I finally listened to God's call through the voices of others. I had been hearing it and although I had considered it, I doubted it. But the voices of encouragement

for me to consider going into ministry weren't going away. Wanting to explore the possibilities of ministry, I enrolled in the East Central Synod of Wisconsin Lay School of Ministry in 2009. The two years of Lay School experience taught me to trust what I had been hearing and to lean into the direction that God had for my life. I had to let go of who I thought I had to be to become the person God had intended me to be. Entranced in to

candidacy for ordained ministry and accepted as a student to Luther Seminary in 2012, life was changing and the journey had just begun.

Throughout my time at Luther, I had the opportunity to learn from some of the top professors and instructors in the world, educators who are the leading experts in their respective fields of study. At various times, I thought that I might specialize as a youth pastor, or a mission developer, or a chaplain. I have had mentors in these specialized areas of ministry that I have great respect for as they have taught me so much about ministry and walking alongside others in their joys, sorrows, and struggles in life. I have grown to be much more aware of the world around me and of the need for others to be heard. Over the course of the past two years, I have been listening. Just the other day, I recalled watching a YouTube video a few years ago about this "Little Church with a Big Heart" that had broadcast a message to the world: "We need a pastor!" As I

think about where we have been and where we are today, I am also reminded of the words from the prophet Isaiah, "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? And I said, "Here am I; send me!" (Isaiah 6:8)

You have called me to be your pastor and words can't express how excited I am to begin this time together. I don't know about you, but I have felt that God is up to something in the community of faith at Hainesville Lutheran Church. Within the intricate web of relationships that have formed in the church, the neighborhood, and the world, there has been an energy that has been building. This is a God thing. Words for today, from 1968

For America, this marks the 50th anniversary of a turbulent year, which included high-profile assassinations, the Vietnam War and civil rights protests. Five decades on, turmoil still abounds. May we take hope and inspiration from Robert Kennedy, who, on the night of Martin Luther King's death, replaced a presidential-campaign speech with these words:

"What we need in the United States is not division; ... not hatred; ... not violence and lawlessness, but ... love, and wisdom, and compassion toward one another; and a feeling of justice toward those who still suffer within our country, whether they be white or ... black."

Kennedy added: "We will have difficult times in the future. ... But the vast majority of white people and ... black people in this country want to live together ... and want justice for all human beings. ... Let's dedicate ourselves ... to tame the savageness of man and make gentle the life of this world ... and say a prayer for our country and for our people."



Report from the 2018 Synod Assembly—Pam & Emery Freiberg

The 2018 Synod Assembly of the East Central Synod of Wisconsin was held May 18-19 in Oshkosh at the Best Western Premier Waterfront Hotel and Convention Center. The Assembly theme was "We Are Church Together—Feeding and Equipping Leaders."

The opening worship and communion service was led by our Bishop Gerald Mansholt. There were over 325 voting and non-voting members in attendance to be filled with the Holy Spirit as we went about the business of the synod. There was so much inspiration and energy felt by being together listening, praying, visiting, worshipping, and feeling the closeness with fellow Christians.

It was exciting to hear Vibrant Faith speaker Jim La Doux speak about Faith Formation Strategies, Discovering Your Call, and Bringing the vision of life to the congregation.

Rev. Chris Boerger, ELCA church-wide secretary reminded us that as "ministry partners" we are church together. It is truly amazing to realize all the wonderful resources that are available to individual congregations within the ELCA, and the plans being made to connect with people using technology.

Bishop Mansholt focused on 5 points in his report: WE MUST BE A

- 1. Thriving Church, spreading/living the Gospel
- 2. Equipping Church, for living out our calling
- 3. Welcoming Church, embracing diversity
- 4. Visible Church, ecumenical-interreligious
- 5. Well governed, well connected, sustainable Church

The Bishop also [presented the Strategic Ministry Vision adopted by the synod in October, 2017. Churches will be hearing more about this vision, and will have a chance to be participants in it later this year.

We were proud and happy to represent Hainesville Church as your synod assembly delegates. It was a wonderful, uplifting experience for us to witness and participate in The Church at Work Together. Thank you for the opportunity.


